## **Finance Committee Update**

### **Budget vs Actuals**

Nothing unexpected

#### **Statement of Financial Position**

- No unexpected changes
- Document is not displaying prior month as usual

## **CD Oversite Vote**

- o Beth and Terri renewing based on Finance Committee vote
- Recently we have been investing in shorter-term CDs since they have had the best rate
- o Finance Committee recommendation
  - Board to approve Terri and Beth to renew based on best rates and share update with the board
- o **DECISION:** APPROVED
  - Motion raised by Donna for Board President and Library Director to make renew CD based on best rates
    - Seconded by Julie
    - Approved by present board members

# **Budget Draft Overview**

- o Reviewed draft discussed during Finance Committee
- Currently showing \$18k deficit
  - This is with assumption of 0% increase from WCCLS, but there may be a 1-2% increase which will get us closer to zero deficit
  - Budget also includes 3% increase to staff pay
  - Includes estimated increase in minimum wage
    - Notification will be released by state 4/30/25
- Next draft of budget expected 3/25/25
- Next Finance Committee meeting scheduled for 4/7/25
- Thank you to Jennie for all of the work she's been putting into the budget

### **Board President's Report**

#### WCCLS - Funding and Governance

- Working to determine base service levels WCCLS will fund for all libraries
  - Not yet confirmed to be 45 hours/week
    - For libraries open more hours than this (ex: Beaverton, Hillsboro), it is likely that associated city or nonprofit organization will have to pay for those additional hours beyond the base service level
- WCCLS will take over choosing materials for libraires through centralized purchasing
- Next piece of work will be determining new service boundaries
  - ACLA boundaries do not truly reflect the unincorporated Washington County area that is Aloha
    - Would need to take area away from Beaverton and Hillsboro service areas to encompass Aloha
    - There may be pushback from cities, as they would be giving up service area which also means giving up funds from WCCLS
      - Hillsboro is more open to Aloha service boundaries extending north of TV Highway as they are in less of a financial crunch than Beaverton
      - Additionally, Beaverton is able to get grants for serving unincorporated areas
- Funding formula not yet determined
  - Still in development
  - County working on this with city and nonprofit library representatives

### Levy Cycle

- Current levy is \$0.22
  - Initial polling researching increasing to \$0.32 and \$0.37
    - o Both amounts are polling well
    - o Looks favorable that the levy will ask for an increase

# **Executive Orders**

- o Nonprofit Association if Oregon hosting weekly webinars on the executive orders
  - Terri is attending a number of these
- Museum and Library Services
  - State library staff could be impacted
  - State is waiting for more direction
  - ALA has released a response asking people to <u>Show Up for Our Libraries</u>
- ACL concerns
  - US Interagency Council on Homelessness
  - Community financial institutions helping are at risk
  - Staff is being cut at a number of federal organizations
  - Will need to figure out what to train staff on and how to handle

## **Chase Bank**

- o Our branch within the mall is closing in June
  - Will make deposits less convenient
- o Terri and Jennie will discuss options and bring to Finance Committee

#### **Community Updates**

- o Meeting Friday 4/4/25 re: new farm store going into former Basics Market space
  - They would like to use outdoor space for hay bales and other outdoor supplies

#### **Building Issues**

- Documents <u>online</u> indicate the building has been for sale since last year
- Outstanding maintenance requests have not been responded to
  - Reached out again 3/8/25
    - o Broken exhaust fans in bathrooms
      - Part came in last summer and was told it would be installed in the fall and work still has not been done
    - o Ceiling tiles damaged in September
    - Metal on front door is sticking out
      - Currently covered with yellow tape to keep it from snagging patrons

## School Supply Drive

- Beginning to receive donations
- Had a good meeting on 3/15/25 with volunteers interested in helping out with this year's schools supply free store
  - Jefferson Chao from <u>WakeUp Beaverton</u> was in attendance
- o Will start out with lighter marketing now and increase over the summer
- Backpack Challenge
  - In the past have held Library Director's Backpack Challenge
  - Our community loves a match challenge
  - Proposing board join or take over the match
    - Several board members interested in joining
      - Okay to reach out to Beth or Terri at a later time if interested
    - Donna will connect with Nike and Columbia to see if she can get any donations
